



MATHS



- Write a booklet explaining some of the trickiest mathematical concepts that you have learnt in Year 5. This could be given to a new Year 5 pupil.
- Learn as many of your times tables and the related divisions as you can.
- Create a poster explaining how to use the column method to multiply two and three digits.
- Identify all prime numbers up to 100. Explain what a prime number is.
- Follow the football World Cup. Find out some interesting statistics and present them using a method of your choice. This could be a graph, chart, etc.
- Ask your parents for a shopping receipt with the total/balance cut off; have a go at adding up all the items. Did you get the correct answer? Can you calculate the change from £20? Remember lots of prices will end in 99p so you will have to round to the next pound to help you calculate.

English



- Use a dictionary to look up words (use the Year 3/4 and 5/6 statutory word lists) or make your own dictionary showing a word per letter.
- Create your own grammar booklet with examples of modal verbs, adverbs, determiners, nouns and adjectives.
- Create a 'how to' guide to punctuation for a younger child.
- Write your very own poem, play script or story about anything you like and read it aloud.

General Activities



We'd like to see a portrait of a 'student' in Ardley Hill uniform, **but** not on pupils like you and your peers – we're talking animal/fantasy creature students here! What would our uniform look like on a mermaid or a dinosaur for example?

Time to let your imagination run wild! There are two choices here:

Create a recipe for a character from a book or film. It could be a drink like Butterbeer in Harry Potter books and films or sweets like Turkish Delight in 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe'.

or...

Create a breakfast recipe (food or drink) for a new Year 6 pupil which will set them up for their big first day. This can be realistic or very imaginative!

In both cases please write out the recipe and explain why you have included the ingredients. We'd love to see photos if you get a chance to make it (with permission).

Hint: As you will be in Year 6 we expect high standards of presentation for your homework. Here are some ideas: use a computer (Word, PowerPoint or another program), writing, drawing, a mixture of photographs and drawings, or any other interesting way that you choose.
